Committee members are appointed to discuss and advocate for increasing access to transit.

- Each committee member is expected to participate in at least one of the subcommittees of CAT: the LIFT Paratransit sub-committee and/or the Fixed Route sub-committee. During the course of the meeting year, additional Ad Hoc committees are presented forth by the CAT executive team.
